Town Manager's Report:

Town Manager Gamble stated that the Pocket Park Project is slowly moving forward with brick masons giving quotes and the Town will be installing the water and sewer.

Matthews Street is almost complete and should be finished before the extended deadline.

Rebranding Project is moving forward with the new logo to be placed on both sides of the 300,000 gallon tank on Hwy 770/US 220 (I-73). Also, new signage is being ordered for Main and Henry Streets. This has been made possible by the \$25,000.00 grant received from the NC Community Foundation. Copy incorporated into the minutes.

The Annual Christmas Parade, stroll and tree lighting will be Saturday, November 25th.
