# Stoneville Town Council Public Hearing and Regular Meeting Minutes August 2, 2016 7:00 PM

**Present:** Present were Mayor Ricky Craddock, Mayor Pro-tem Chuck Hundley,

Councilwoman Lori Armstrong, Councilmen Bill Farris, Henry Thornton and Jerry

Smith.

Also present were Town Manager Kenneth Gamble, Human Resource/Finance Officer Joanna Dalton, Town Clerk Sherri Darnell, Public Works Director Mark Malloy, Police Chief Frank Moore, Police Captain Brandon Rivera, Police Administrative Assistant Perry Webster, Parks & Recreation Director Jackie Blackard, Fire Chief Tim Brown and Town Attorney Travis Martin.

Welcome: Mayor Ricky Craddock welcomed the assembly. After the Pledge of Allegiance

and Invocation, Mayor Craddock called the meeting to order.

Minutes: Mayor Ricky Craddock asked if there were any corrections to the minutes from

the last meetings. With no corrections, Mayor Craddock asked for a motion to approve the minutes. Councilman Farris made the motion to approve the

minutes. Councilman Smith seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**Agenda:** Mayor Ricky Craddock asked if there were any adjustments to the originally

submitted Agenda. Town Manager Gamble asked to remove item #5 USDA Loan Resolution and Item #9 Backflow Prevention Program. With these changes Mayor Craddock asked for a motion to approve the Agenda. Councilwoman Armstrong made the motion to approve the Agenda. Mayor Pro-tem Hundley

seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **Public Hearing USDA Development Grant for Police Vehicle:**

Mayor Craddock asked for a motion to open the public hearing. Councilman Thornton made the motion. Councilwoman Armstrong seconded the motion. Motion carried. Town Manager Gamble stated that we are receiving a 55% grant to purchase the Police Vehicle and that the USDA requires a public hearing to be held. The loan and Town match will be \$11,582.00 and the local match (\$3282) will be absorbed by the Police Department budget with no amendments. No one had signed up to speak. Mayor Craddock then asked for a motion to close this Public Hearing. Councilman Smith made the motion. Councilman Farris seconded. Motion carried.

#### **Public Hearing for Annexation of Church Street MHP:**

Mayor Craddock asked for a motion to open this public hearing. Councilwoman Armstrong made the motion. Councilman Farris seconded. Motion carried. Mr. Jared White owner of Church Street MHP spoke regarding his desire to have the mobile home park annexed into the corporate limits by adding the undeveloped tract of land owned by Church Street MHP to his request.

Mr. Paul Ewing of Southern View Mobile Home Park spoke stating that he would also submit a request for annexation.

Mr. Bobby Stanley stated that he would also like to have his properties annexed. Mayor Craddock then asked for a motion to close this public hearing. Mayor Pro-tem Hundley made the motion. Councilwoman Armstrong seconded the motion. Motion carried.

After some discussion and the interest of two (2) additional parties, Councilman Smith made the motion to table this until the September meeting. Councilman Farris seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **New Business:**

#### **Recognition of Award:**

Mayor Craddock read the Governor's Medallion for Volunteer Service that was awarded to Councilman Henry Thornton on April 2, 2016. Copy incorporated into the minutes.

#### **Introduction of Part-Time Fire Personnel:**

Fire Chief Brown introduced Anita Webster, Brian Slaughter, Kenny Loftis, Mason James and Josh Wallace as the part-time fire fighters that are working from 7 am to 3 pm on a rotating basis to the Council.

#### Stoneville Elementary PTA Request to Use the Park for 2017 Fundraiser:

Ginger Tilley of the Stoneville Elementary PTA asked to hold a fundraiser at the Stoneville Memorial Park on May 13, 2017 with set up to be on May 12, 2017. Ms. Tilley explained that this fundraiser will serve the children of our community with the additional funding needed for supplies and equipment needed during the school year. After some discussion, Councilman Smith made a motion to allow the use of the Park on these dates and waive all fees. Councilman Thornton seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **Fall Festival Request:**

Mr. Bobby Stanley asked Council to again be a sponsor of the annual Fall Festival with a donation of \$250.00. With some discussion, Councilman Smith made a motion to sponsor this event with a \$300.00 donation. Mayor Pro tem Hundley seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **Parks and Recreation Annual Report:**

Director Blackard presented his report stating that by changing some of the programs, we have had a 4% increase in revenue. Mr. Blackard also highlighted the upcoming golf tournament to be held in October and the addition of men's fall basketball to be some of the main 16-17 initiatives. Copy incorporated into the minutes.

#### 2017 4th of July Park Event:

Director Blackard stated that there had been interest expressed in holding an event at the park for July 4<sup>th</sup> and asked the Council for direction. After much discussion, by consensus the Council decided that a committee should be formed to determine what can be done. Councilmen Hundley and Smith agreed to serve on the committee.

#### **Medication Drop Box:**

Police Chief Moore stated that medication drop box will be installed in Town Hall for residents to dispose of old or unwanted medications. This drop by is provided free of charge by Project Lazarus. Mr. Jeff Pruett gave a presentation explaining the program and how well it is working in other municipalities and counties.

#### **NCCF Grant Application for Downtown Improvements:**

Town Manager Gamble stated that funding is available through the North Carolina Community Foundation (Duke Energy Coal Ash). Mr. Gamble stated that he would like to partner with the Stoneville Rotary to renew the Rotary Park and demolish the roofless building that stands behind it. The property owner has agreed to donate the park property and the property that contains this building to the town. After little discussion, Councilman Thornton made the motion to allow the pursuit of this grant. Councilwoman Armstrong seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **Cell Tower Lease Extension Proposal:**

Town Manager Gamble informed the Council that our cell tower lease still has 20 years left on it. American Tower had submitted a request to extend this lease with a signing bonus, but no changes in the scheduled increases. After much discussion, it was decided to leave the lease as it is. Copy incorporated into the minutes.

#### **Waste Management Early Contract Renewal Request:**

Town Manager Gamble stated that our current contract with Waste Management would not expire until June 30, 2017. However, Waste Management had approached Mr. Gamble regarding an early renewal. The highlights are a 3 year term, house count based on active accounts and reduction in cost that will allow the Town to reduce recycling charges per household by \$1.50 per month. After some discussion, Councilwoman Armstrong made a motion to accept the terms of the new early renewal contract. Councilman Smith seconded the motion. Motion carried. Copy incorporated into the minutes.

#### Water Bill Adjustment Ricky Craddock:

Town Manager Gamble stated that due to an incident at Ricky Craddock's home at 102 Vernon Street, that Mr. Craddock was seeking an adjustment above the one-third that staff can apply. After some discussion, Councilman Farris made a motion to reduce the bill to a six month average, as done in the past. Councilman Smith seconded the motion. Motion carried. Copy incorporated into the minutes.

**Public Comments:** There were no public comments

#### **Town Manager's Report:**

Town Manager Gamble stated that we have been approved for the sewer grant through the Asset Inventory & Assessment Grant for \$81,000.00 with a \$9,000.00 local match. However, the water system grant was not competitive enough to make the cut. The Bryan Street bridge maintenance was quoted at \$18,000.00. Public Works performed the work on a Saturday with a cost of less than \$750.00. The new lighting of the Municipal Building is 90% complete. We will be monitoring usage costs and comparing them from the last 3 years.

Cruise-In is Friday, August 19<sup>th</sup>.

Senior Appreciation Breakfast is Saturday, September 10<sup>th</sup> from 7 to 11 AM.

Fall Festival is Saturday, September 24<sup>th</sup> from 9 AM to 6 PM.

#### **Executive Session:**

Mayor Craddock asked for a motion to enter into executive session. Councilman Farris made the motion. Councilman Smith seconded. Motion carried.

#### **Regular Session:**

Mayor Craddock asked for a motion to return to regular session. Councilwoman Armstrong made the motion. Mayor Pro tem Hundley seconded. Motion carried.

Mayor Craddock stated that during executive session economic development matters were discussed with no action taken.

Mayor Craddock also stated that a personnel issue was discussed. Councilman Farris made a motion to increase Police Chief Moore's salary by 5%, making his salary \$2,125.00 more annually. Councilman Thornton seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **Public Hearing Meeting Script**

September 6, 2016 Town of Stoneville Stoneville Town Hall

This public hearing on September 6, 2016, will provide an explanation and description of the 2016 North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) Community Development Block – Infrastructure Grant (CDBG-I).

We are present to discuss the purpose of the public hearing for Town of Stoneville's CDBG-I funding application. The purpose of the public hearing is to obtain citizen's views and to allow response from the public to funding proposals and answer any questions posed by citizens. This public hearing will cover the Town's community development needs, development of the proposed activities, and a review of program compliance before the submission of the Town's CDBG-I funding application to the state of the North Carolina.

The Town proposes to request funding from NCDEQ'S CDBG-I program for the Sanitary Sewer System Rehabilitation Project. The purpose of the CDBG-I grant program is:

To improve the quality of life for low to moderate income people by providing a safe, clean environment and clean drinking water through water and sewer infrastructure improvements and extensions of service.

- To benefit a residential area where at least 51% of the beneficiaries are low to moderate income as defined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.
- To perform eligible activities.
- To minimize displacement, and
- Provide displacement assistance as necessary.

For the fiscal year of the CDBG-I funding available is expected to \$26 million. The maximum available grant is \$2.0 million over a 3-year period. Applications for funding will be received on September 30, 2016.

The CDBG program is able to fund a wide variety of community development activities. The State of North Carolina has chosen to fund two activities: water and sewer infrastructure, and economic development projects that lead to job creation or retention. The infrastructure program, or CDBG-I program can fund a range of water and sewer infrastructure activities, including, but not limited to the, following:

#### Water:

- Projects that resolve water loss in distribution systems.
- Projects that extend public water to areas with contaminated wells.
- Projects that extend water lines to areas with dry wells.
- Projects that assist with low water pressure in public water systems.
- Projects that regionalize two or more water systems.
- Project that rehabilitate or replace a water treatment plant.

#### Wastewater:

- Projects that resolve inflow and infiltration to collection systems and surcharges from pumps stations and manholes.
- Projects that extent public sewer to areas with failed septic tanks.
- Projects that rehabilitate a wastewater treatment plant to allow for greater efficiency/compliance with regulations.

The Town is seeking an amount in CDBG-I funds not to exceed \$1,240,000 for the Sanitary Sewer System Rehabilitation project. The purpose of the Town's request is to complete a sanitary sewer system rehabilitation project that will eliminate inflow and infiltration from the Town's wastewater collection system.

The project proposed by the Town of Stoneville is identified in the Town's Capital Improvement Plan in in the current 2016/2017 budget planning period. Informal community meetings were held in the project area to inform citizens of the potential project, and get feedback from the residents.

A total of 100% of the CDBG-I funding will be used to benefit Low to Moderate Income (LMI) people. The project area in the Town of Stoneville has been determined to have an income survey area of 82.9%. The project area includes N. Henry Street, Highland Avenue, Kellam Street, Dalton Street and Roberts Street. The range of activities covered by the CDBG-I funds for the Sanitary Sewer System Rehabilitation Project includes:

- Construction.
- Environmental Review
- Engineering Design
- Construction Administration and observation
- Legal activities
- Surveying
- Grant Administration

If the Town of Stoneville is awarded a CDBG-I grant, the town is required to adhere to federal procurement requirements and other federal regulations which include:

- American with Disabilities Act/Section 504 Survey
- Davis-Bacon & Related Labor Acts
- Adoption/Submittal of a Citizen's Participation Plan
- Adoption/Submittal of an Equal Opportunity Plan
- Adoption/Submittal of a Fair Housing Plan
- Adoption/Submittal of a Language Access Plan
- Adoption/Submittal of a Relocation Assistance Plan
- Adoption/Submittal of a Section 3 Plan
- Excess Force Provision

The State of North Carolina requires that the if the Town of Stoneville receives CDBG grant funding that the town will certify that they will comply with the requirements of the general displacement and relocation policy for CDBG grant funding. This policy assists low to moderate income people with costs associated with relocation or displacement, should such relocation become necessary due to the project activities. CDBG funds can be used for those costs, if necessary. If no displacement and relocation will occur as a result of the proposed CDBG grant activity, then the Town of Stoneville confirms that during this public hearing.

In the past, the Town has applied for and received funding for several CDBG projects. The Town has successfully completed and closed out all projects with no findings or concerns. Following is a summary of the completed projects:

- 2009 CDBG Economic Development
   \$375,000 grant award Sewer Improvements to serve Sans Technical Fibers
- 2002 CDBG Infrastructure \$750,000 grant award – Sewer Improvements - US 220 Business
- 2001 CDBG Economic Development
   \$705,000 grant award Sewer Improvements to serve Southern Finishing
- 1998 CDBG Disaster Recovery
   \$98,250 grant award Disaster Recovery from Tornado
- 1996 CDBG Scattered Site Housing \$465,000 grant award – Housing rehabilitation to LMI households

The Town will submit its CDBG-I application for the Sanitary Sewer System Rehabilitation project on September 30, 2016. The CDBG-I application will be available for review during normal business hours at Stoneville Town Hall, 101 Smith Street, Stoneville. NC 27048. That the **Applicant** will provide for efficient operation and maintenance of the project on completion of construction thereof.

That Ricky Craddock, Mayor, and Ken Gamble, Town Manager, the **Authorized Officials**, and successors so titled, is hereby authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of the **Applicant** with the State of North Carolina for a grant to aid in the construction of the project described above.

That the **Authorized Officials**, and successors so titled, is hereby authorized and directed to furnish such information as the appropriate State agency may request in connection with such application or the project; to make the assurances as contained above; and to execute such other documents as may be required in connection with the application.

That the **Applicant** has substantially complied or will substantially comply with all Federal, State, and local laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances applicable to the project and to Federal and State grants and loans pertaining thereto.

# Town of Stoneville Capital Improvement Plan

2016 - 2021



**Sanitary Sewer System** 

<u>Goal Statement</u>: The goal of the Town of Stoneville Capital Improvement Plan is to identify infrastructure in need of replacement / rehabilitation, plan and prioritize future projects and project costs so the elected Council can make sound financial decisions.

## **Project Areas**

- <u>1.</u> <u>Matthews Street Outfall</u> The outfall segment begins at MH 197 near the intersection of North Glenn Street and West Matthews Street and continues to MH 346 at the site of an abandoned imhoff tank.
  - <u>a.</u> <u>Existing Facility</u> This section of the collection system dates back to the early 1930s. Most of the pipe installed is 8" clay with caulked joints, but there is some 6" clay pipe as well.
  - b. Known Deficiencies The Town experienced a severe rain event January 17-18, 2013 that resulted in increased pump run times at all pump stations, increased extraneous flow and a significant wastewater overflow in the Matthews Street area. The spill report and resulting Notice of Violation from NCDENR noted a total overflow of 77,143 gallons, almost all of which entered nearby ditches tributary to a stream. In addition to this event, there have been five (5) additional overflows since January 2013 with three (3) Notice of Violation issued by the state. There have also been numerous sewer back-up calls that did not result in an overflow as well. The lines are decomposing with some areas of partial collapse and flattening.
  - <u>c.</u> <u>Future Needs</u> Replacement of 2,800 LF of 8" gravity sewer, manholes and appurtenances is required to address the deficiencies.

# 2. Central Stoneville Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation & Replacement

- The central sanitary sewer system is located in the heart of Stoneville under Henry Street (MH 216 – MH 8), South Glenn Street (MH 192 – MH 15) and Stone Street (MH 96 – MH 245). The

forced main line that pumps sewage from the Church Street pumping station runs from Stone Mountain Road to Business 220 and terminates on Price Street.

- <u>a.</u> <u>Existing Facility</u> The majority of the system was placed into service in the late 1930s. Most of the pipe installed was clay with caulked joints but some 4" Orangeburg pipe remains in service as well. The 6" ductile iron forced main line was constructed in 1974.
- b. Known Deficiencies As is typical with aging systems with significant quantities of clay pipe, excessive wet weather flow has become an increasingly difficult problem for staff. Inflow and rainfall induced infiltration have resulted in eight (8) overflow violations since May 2013. Public Works staff must regularly respond during heavy rain events and have septic tank contractors pump and haul wastewater. Inflow and Infiltration has increased the cost of operating the system and the rates charged to customers.
- <u>c.</u> <u>Future Needs</u> Either a system removal and replacement or a trenchless collection system rehabilitation is required to address these issues. Capacity upgrades at the Church Street pumping station and installation of a new 8" forced main line is also needed.
- 3. Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation N. Henry Street / Highland
  Avenue / Kellam Street / Dalton Street / Roberts Street This
  section of the sanitary sewer system serves a low income area of
  town in the northwest corner of Stoneville. It includes the streets
  named above with Man Holes 197 & 205-210 serving the area. It
  empties into the Matthews Street Outfall, where we have been
  addressing severe I&I issues and replacing failing infrastructure.

- <u>a.</u> <u>Existing Facility</u> This section of the system was placed into service in the late 1930s. The pipe installed was 8" clay with caulked joints.
- <u>b. Known Deficiencies</u> This project is upstream of recent sanitary sewer overflow concerns, as well as being a continuation of the Matthews Street Outfall Replacement project. Eliminating these old deteriorated lines will further address the concerns of overflows along Matthews Street and the surrounding area.
- <u>c.</u> <u>Future Needs</u> Rehabilitation and/or replacement of approximately 4700 LF of 8" gravity sewer lines.
- **4. Manhole Repairs** The sanitary sewer system has 385 manholes located in and around Stoneville.
  - **a.** Existing Facility The collection system manholes are a combination of masonry and concrete. They range in age from circa 1930 to 2004.
  - b. Known Deficiencies Manholes are required to be inspected once a year. In addition to the annual inspection Town staff look at manholes in the course of preventative line maintenance and clearing back-ups. Manholes in need of repair or replacement are addressed as soon as practical. However, staff recognizes that manhole conditions may deteriorate significantly between inspections.
  - **c.** <u>Future Needs</u> We project that approximately 5-10 manholes will need to be replaced due to age, root damage, exposure to excessive hydrogen sulfide gas or other issues every 3 4 years.

- <u>5.</u> <u>High Priority Line I&I</u> The sanitary sewer system has 12 high priority lines scattered in and around Stoneville.
  - a. Existing Facility High priority lines are ductile iron and 6" 8" in diameter. They range in age from circa 1950 to 2005.
  - **b.** Known Deficiencies High priority lines are inspected twice each year. In addition to these inspections staff observe high priority lines in the course of easement clearing, preventative maintenance and clearing back-ups. High priority line repairs are given top priority for completion.
  - **c.** <u>Future Needs</u> We project, due to age and condition, that some of our high priority lines will need either replacement or maintenance to eliminate Inflow and Infiltration and avoid SSO's.


